Would you like to take part in a research study?

What? The research explores the ways that gender minority (TQI+) youth experience schools and health services in the UK.

Why? There is an urgent need for more evidence on the experiences of gender diverse youth in these settings to support the design of better and more inclusive services.

Who? The research is being carried out at the Centre for Gender Studies, University of Cambridge, together with Coram International, a London based charity supporting children and young people.

We would like to talk to you if you are...

A **young person** aged 14-24 years who is transgender, intersex, non-binary, genderqueer, gender fluid, gender non-conforming or gender questioning;

A **parent** or **carer** of a child or adolescent who is gender variant;

A **professional/ support worker/ counsellor/ clinician** who works with gender variant children and youth;

A **health or education professional** who works with young people ages 14-24 years (e.g. secondary school teacher, GP etc.)

Research participants will receive a £30 shopping voucher in acknowledgment of their time.

All information collected during the research will be kept strictly confidential and anonymised in any research outputs.
